American Recovery Act Program Funds (ARPA)

- The Town has been awarded over \$900,000 in ARPA funds, which is based on population and annual budget. The funds are restricted to certain spending options, but one of the categories allowed is for water and sewer
- Council voted to purchase a much-needed sewer jetter (pictured above) and sewer camera in December, 2021, and the jetter has already been put to work, saving the Town staff time which equates to money
- Council also voted to establish a Real Estate investment program, which allocates \$40,000 towards a matching grant program to help combat blight in the Commercial, Trade and Manufacturing-zoned districts. Each brick-and-mortar business can apply for up to \$5,000 in matching funds for needs such as fencing, signage, façade improvements, awnings, and much more. Mobile Farmers' Market - Monthly in Buchanan

A new event will be happening in Buchanan the 4th Wednesday of each month! The Local Office on Aging for Botetourt and Craig County approached the Town and asked if LEAP (Local Environmental Agricultural Project, Inc.), a Roanoke-based 501 (c) 3 nonprofit and Feeding SW Virginia could set up in Buchanan. Wednesday, January 26th was LEAP's first appearance! Set up was at 1:30PM, but this may vary in upcoming months – please call Town Hall with questions.

Food is set up on tables in farmers' market style in the parking lot at the Botetourt County Resource Center. LEAP offers fresh fruit/vegetables, breads, cheeses, meats, and jams/sauces. The emphasis is to sell food from local farmers.

The LEAP markets offer Healthy Food Incentives – use SNAP / EBT (food stamps), P-EBT, or show proof of Medicaid, WIC, or TAP Head Start, and for every \$1 you spend, get an additional \$1 FREE for fruits and vegetables.
